Bicycling Across North Carolina

I don't know what all I can say about this bike trip, but I rode my bicycle across the state of North Carolina. This was the second time that I rode across the state, I did it in 2005.

I started training for the ride in May and had to stop training in June due to the illness. I normally like to have 12 weeks of training to complete a ride this long.

But in August I decided to go for it, which left only seven weeks to whip myself into shape. Considering that in July I couldn't hardly walk from one end of the house to the other I was so weak. The only way that I can explain recouping my strength is that "God did it."

I went with an organization that calls itself "Cycle North Carolina." Their sole purpose is to organize, plan and promote this ride each year. It's a seven day ride and each year we ride through different cities and towns with over 1000 bicyclists. The ride is mostly on low traffic back-roads and we are fortunate enough to go into very old historic towns in the state and see some beautiful scenery along the way.

We start each year in the western part of the state and bicycle to the coast. This year we started in West Jefferson and went to Currituck, which is a small town close to the Virginia State Line.

This year the weather was cold at the beginning in West Jefferson, where we had ice on our tents the morning of the first day. And seven days later it was 80 degrees in Currituck.

Each route each day was from 50 to 106 miles. One day I took the over 100 mile route because I had not biked 100 miles in one day ever before and I wanted to do what we call “a century” which is a 100 daily mile ride.

I rode a total of 492 miles in seven days and I have my daily journals on the internet on my website if there is any interest.

~Making it Right~ ~A Personal Story~

In 1977, I was leaving work from the company parking lot and had an accident, I backed into a car. You say, so what, that happens every day. What was so unusual about this accident was that I left the parking lot without letting the owner know what I had done.

Over the years I thought about it a time or two. One reason I tell you this, it shows the way your heart can be hardened over the years and then softened by God when under conviction. Then about a couple of years ago I started getting convicted by the Holy Spirit about this accident.

I thought about it more and more over the past couple of years. I couldn't read the Bible or start writing a sermon or article because of the guilt. I felt unholy and anything I wrote was living a lie.

Sometimes when sitting in the pews and listening to sermons, God would convict me of this accident and tears would come to my eyes. I finally got so much under conviction that I had to settle it with the owner of that car, which, by the way, lives out of town now.

I have done a lot of things a lot worst than this, but God convicted me of this one sin. I don't know what else to call it but, sin. I

did it and I wanted to repent and make it right with the owner of the vehicle I had backed into.

One night several months ago I got on the internet and as God would have it there was only one person in that town with his name. So I couldn't use that for an excuse anymore not to call him. I picked up the phone and dialed the number. All the time hoping that there would be no answer. (Can anyone here relate to this?)

As God would have it, that person answered the phone. I explained to him what I had done and wanted to make it right with him. He graciously accepted by apology and said I owed him nothing.

There was a weight of guilt that was lifted off me. Only by the Blood of Jesus was this possible; a cleansing of the Soul, through repentance for someone that was wronged.

25th Wedding Anniversary

Martha and I celebrated our 25th Wedding Anniversary this past June. It was one of the most touching moments in our 30 plus years we have known each other. I cried through the whole ceremony.

E coli Bacteria

I have been blessed with good health. But, somewhere around the third week in June this year, I started feeling bad, with aches, pains, headache, etc. - Flu like symptoms. It had been as most of you know a very hot and dry summer. I just thought I had been in the sun too long. But as the week progressed along I started feeling worse and worse. By Thursday of that week I was bedfast. I just felt too bad and weak to do anything.

A week or so before I got sick I went to Pennsylvania on a church seminar and we stayed at a camp setting. The brother that went with me got sick on the way up for about two days and then was okay.

Also my wife Martha had the 24 hour flu a few days before I got sick. So I thought that was what I had because I had been exposed to two people who had the flu like symptoms and in a few days they were fine.

But as I lay on the sofa I kept getting worse. By late Saturday I told Martha that I've got to do something. This had been about three days I had been laid up. Why God chose that moment in time for me

to say I was ready for help, I don't know. But I believe we all have appointed times for everything that we do or happens in our life.

I took a quick shower and dressed and headed to Hickory to one of those urgent care facilities. I figured I just needed a doctor and he would prescribe some medicine and I would be good as new. Why God chose that doctor and that clinic to go to, I don't know. But I'm glad He did.

Some doctors may not have dug in as deep as this doctor did. They may have just treated me for flu symptoms and sent me home. -- -- Who knows! But, God (Elohim) took care of it!

After driving to Hickory the doctor wasn't sure they could help me, but after interviewing me they said they thought they could get to the bottom of the illness. They were very honest and straight forward about whether or not they could help. They ran many tests one by one. As they ran one test after another, they would come back into the room and say it doesn't look good, you are a sick man.

They finally diagnosed me with bacteria in my urine and blood stream. I found out a few days later, that it was the E coli bacteria. When in the urine it can be treated, but it turns deadly when it enters your blood stream. They put me on a strong antibiotic and sent me to the emergency room for IVs, since I was so dehydrated.

It was two or three days later that I found how serious it was when the doctor received the blood cultures back. He called me and said it was the E coli Bacteria Virus and if I had not gotten help I may not have lasted another couple of days. Then it dawned on me that I could have died. But the Lord, as He saved my soul, now saved my body.

Why I got the E coli bacteria, I don't know. Why my immune system didn't defense it, I don't know. Why God let me get sick with

this bacteria, I don't know. The only thing I know is that God is sovereign and God is in control and everything will be okay with God.

You know, a lot of times we may be close to death and don't even know it. Maybe that car accident that would have happened and you just missed it by a few seconds. Or that disease or sickness that you caught and you didn't even know you had it because of your immune system that kicked in and took care of it. That was God!

I think it was Martin Luther, when asked by someone about a staggering drunk walking down the road said, "If it wasn't for the grace of God I would be that man." Well, if it wasn't for the grace of God I may be dead today.

Sermon – The Clock is Ticking

Time is constantly moving, there no stopping it. You will never be at this place in time again, you will never hear this message at this time again at this point in time, you will never eat the dinner you ate tonight at that point in time. The clock is ticking.

We can't stop the clock; it continues to move regardless of what we want. You can unplug your clock or take the batteries out, but time continues. There's an old Indian proverb that says: "We never set foot in the same water twice, the river is always flowing."

Let us check out Matthew 9:35-38; *Jesus was going through all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every kind of disease and every kind of sickness. (Matthew 9:35 NASB) Seeing the people, He felt compassion for them, because they were distressed and dispirited like sheep without a shepherd. (Matthew 9:36 NASB) Then He *said to His disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. (Matthew 9:37 NASB) "Therefore beseech the Lord of the harvest to send out workers into His harvest." (Matthew 9:38 NASB)*

Do you think Jesus wasted any of his time while here on earth? Even when He was twelve years old he was spreading the word? *And he said unto them, **How is it that ye sought me? wist ye not that I must be about my Father's business?*** (Luke 2:49 KJVR)

Yeshua and His disciples were totally exhausted at times. *And He said to them, **"Come away by yourselves to a secluded place and rest a while."*** (For there were many people coming and going, and they did not even have time to eat.) (Mark 6:31 NASB)

Jesus had only three or 3 ½ years after He started His ministry to train His twelve disciples to carry the Word and to prepare them to teach others to help reach the world with The Gospel. Do we all have that urgently? The clock is ticking.

We have less time today than we had yesterday to fulfill this mission. Will our mission be fulfilled? Will God say to any of us? *"His master said to him, **'Well done, good and faithful slave. You were faithful with a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master.'*** (Matthew 25:21 NASB)

Robert Logan Patton IV – Setting the Example

Robert Logan Patton IV was one of the Patton family members that the Robert L. Patton High School was named after. He was the beginning of many of the Pattons that helped mold the school system and public education in this area. I came across this information while searching for some history on the Glen Alpine school district and its origination a few days ago.

The life of Robert Logan Patton IV was characterized by intense loyalties to religion and education. Being devout by nature and belief, he frequently preached, and during the week never opened school without religious exercises. This is a long way from the school system

we have today where you can't mention or teach the Bible and Jesus Christ without being sued, fired from your job or expelled from school.

In a private letter that Patton hastily wrote to a daughter, he unconsciously epitomized his conception of life and its supreme duty: "At best life is short. Opportunities will soon be behind us. I am doing all I can in school for the Master."

To Robert Logan Patton IV religion was a way of life –not a creed. This conception induced him to devote his major energies to the school rather than to the pulpit since he was also a preacher. In the classroom he found the fullest opportunity to mold youth and build character.

In his twilight years he was partially paralyzed, but with an active mind he continued his contacts by distributing Christian literature to former students and friends always enclosing an inspirational personal message that was warmly received and appreciated.

Will we all be able to say what Paul said.....; *I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: (2 Tim 4:7 KJV)*

Preachy Dewey
