I Can RememberJust Barely by Dew Fox

As you get older you remember some of your child-hood. What you did and maybe why? I can remember the cold winters we had and the snows. Now-adays it doesn't seem to get very cold and doesn't snow very often. I know for the last two or three winters I don't think we have got much more than a dusting of snow. Hadn't even been able to build a snowman.

About every winter when I was a kid, without fell, the water and water pump would freeze up from the cold weather. In those days we made out the best we could. We would construct double wood sides for the pump house and fill the inside of the sides with sawdust. No insulation in those days or we couldn't afford it. It worked pretty good as long as it didn't get wet.

Thinking back I can remember that the foundation of the house was large rocks at the corners and the rest of the underpinning was open, allowing the wind to blow under the house and there was not insulation under the house either. Made for some cold winters. And my feet got cold.

I also remember the front yard of the house. Instead of mowing the yard, we would sweep it since there was no grass and of course we didn't have a lawn mower. They were push mowers in those days.

Early in my life, we didn't have running water into the house. We had an outdoor toilet, and a well that we manually draw water. Weekly, when mother would do the laundry, we had a lot of water to draw from the well.




The little girl - our mascot - was Jayne Morgan. Not sure if she's related to Donald Morgan's family??? Eager to know.

The North Carolina state dog is the Plott Hound. This dog is the only dog known that originated in the



mountains of N. C. around the year 1750 as well as the only dog known to have originated in the state. It was named for Jonathan Plott who developed the breed for wild boar hunting. Most today are used by coon hunters.

The state bird is of course the Cardinal, a brilliant red bird, especially beautiful in the winter. It was selected as the state bird on March 4, 1943.




Since 1946 the state flower has been the dogwood. A wise choice. It has the beautiful white four pedal blooms in spring and early summer.



You probable will not know this one unless you are a fisherman, but the state fish is the channel



bass. These fish swim in the Tar Heel coastal waters and average between 30 and 40 pounds.
