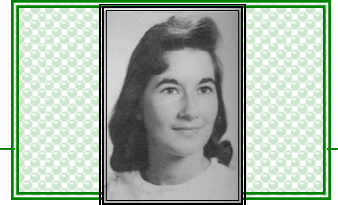
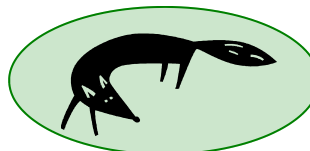
GORDON SHUFFLER

The Lord blessed me with 2 dear friends that really helped provide me with a loving and lasting friendship. We still keep in touch today. My college days began at Mitchell College in Statesville where I graduated with an Associate Degree. I transferred to Le-noir Rhyne University and graduated with my Bachelor of Arts in Elementary Education.

My first students were 6th graders at Oak Hill Elementary School. From there I moved to 5th grade at Drexel Elementary School, and then to 4th grade and 3rd grade at Glen Alpine Elementary School.. It was ironic that I began my schooling at Glen Alpine and actually ended my teaching career by retiring from there after 32 years in the classroom. After retirement I taught for 8 years in Title I serving Glen Alpine and W.A. Young Elementary Schools. I have taught children of my classmates as well as children of my former students.

After college I met a very nice young man, Bobby Arrowood, from Salem. We began dating and later married. He was employed at Henredon for 40 years and served as Supervisor. We just celebrated our 45th anniversary this past January. We were blessed with a son, Greg, who lived a very short life—May 15, 1968-June 22, 1975. He was diagnosed with leukemia at the age of 3 and passed away at the very early age of 7. That was the darkest day of our lives!! Had it not been for family, friends, church family, and the love of Christ we could never have survived the grief and heartache. In his few years here on earth, he touched many lives. We made many friends through him that otherwise we would never have known. One special person, Dolly Maxwell, was an airline stewardess with Eastern Airlines at that time. 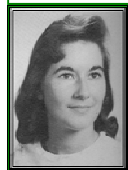
“I remember, Just Barely.....” Dewey Fox

It brought back the memory of my younger days when I had and cherished a raccoon cap as supposedly Daniel Boone wore one just like it, and I was proud of that. I had a cap like frontiersman Daniel Boone. I don't know what finally happened to my cap, but it was my status symbol at the time. Or was I just crazy?

Eyeball to Eyeball— With a Snake. We always had hogs and cattle when I was younger and going to school, so I had chores to do each afternoon after school. Back as far as I remember, the month of June was known as Dairy Month.

In 1960, the people planning the annual dairy celebration decided they should include a Dairy Princess contest.

The requirements for the 1960 Burke county Dairy Princess were that she had to be at 17 and not more than 23 by June 1, a senior in high school, not now or previously married, in good health and a resident of North Carolina for at least one year. No contestant could be a professional model; neither could she hold any other state beauty title or be a previous winner in a Dairy Princess contest. And last and not least, she had to consume and enjoy milk and other dairy products.

They based judging on several subjective qualities, the most important being a pleasing voice, ability to think before an audience and effectiveness of presentation. Contestants earned more points for friendliness and ability to meet people, beauty, personality, poise, being photogenic and having natural-colored hair.

Eleven contestants vied for the 1960 Dairy Princess title. Among them from our class in Glen Alpine were Sunny Nell Browning and Avis Deane Anderson. Sunny Nell Browning was second runner-up.

As your may know, Joshua was what we would probably call today, the right-hand man to Moses. And when Moses died, Joshua was charged with leading the Israelites into the Promised Land. (See Deuteronomy Chapter 31)

Joshua, Chapter 1, verse six, God tells Joshua to “be strong and courageous.” Then in verse seven, God tells Joshua to “be strong and very courageous” again, but in this verse He tells Joshua to be strong and “Very” courageous. God goes on in verse seven and eight. Let me just quote it from the Bible.

“Only be strong and very courageous; be careful to do according to all the law which Moses My servant commanded you; do not turn from it to the right or to the left, so that you may have success wherever you go. [JOSHUA 1:7] [NAS]

“This book of the law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do according to all that is written in it; for then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have success. [JOSHUA 1:8] [NAS]

God instructed Joshua to “be strong and courageous,” and God goes on and tells him to “be careful to do according to all the law,” and “do not turn from it to the right or to the left.”

Hopefully the lesson for today; and the questions we should ask ourselves:

Are we strong and courageous when God calls?

Are we turning to right or left from the “Word of God”?

Are we departing from the “Book of the Law”?

Are we meditating on “The Word” day and night?

As we close for today with verse nine, let me ask the question again. When we have a call from God, are we being “strong and courageous?” If the call or mission is from God, then God is with you at all times. You will accomplish your call or mission.

“Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous! Do not tremble or be dismayed, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go.” [JOSHUA 1:9] [NAS]
